BOOKS (MLA 7th Ed. uses the word 'Print' after ALL printed resources. See examples under boxes.)

AUTHOR. (Last name first)	Title. (<i>Italics preferred or underline.</i>)	City of Publication:	Publisher,	© Date.

Example 1: Baines, John, and Barbara Jones. *This Fragile Earth*. Toronto: Simon, 1991. Print

Note: More than 3 authors: Smith, John et al.

Example 2: Gregory, Tony. *The Dark Ages*. New York: Facts on File, 1993. Print.

Note: Unfamiliar city? Also list state or country: Tavistock, UK

ENCYCLOPEDIAS (Widely used reference books, Example 1, = no author. Less familiar, Example 2 = with author.)

NO AUTHOR LISTED	"Article Title."	Name of Reference book. (<i>Italics</i>)	Edition. (i.e. 2nd ed.)	© Date.	
AUTHOR of Article.	"Article Title."	Name of Reference book. (<i>Italics</i>)	City of Publication:	Publisher,	© Date.

Example 1: "Feudalism." *Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary*. 11th ed. 2003. Print.

Example 2: Weigel, Marlene. *UXL Encyclopedia of Biomes 3*. Farmington Hills, MI: Gale Group, 2000. Print.

ONLINE DATABASES (Check for exact database citation to copy into a document. Follow date published with the word 'Web'.)

AUTHOR. (Last name first.)	"Article Title."	<i>Title of Reference Work.</i> (Add city, publisher, and © if known.)	Name of Database.	Date Accessed (Day Month Year.) Eg. 12 Dec. 2010.

Example 1: Pyle, Kenneth B. "Hiroshima." *World Book Advanced*. World Book, 2010. Web. 4 Feb. 2010.

Example 2: "Rabies." *Clinical Reference Systems* (n.d.): Consumer Health Complete. EBSCO. Web. 4 Feb. 2010.

WEBSITES (Record all available information. Capitalize all important words. You may also cite images using this section. Follow date published with the word 'Web'. In MLA 7th edition URLs are optional. Check with your teacher to ask if URLs are required.)

AUTHOR. (Last name first.)	<i>"Title of Work."</i> (If different also add the <i>Title of Overall Website.</i>)	Website publisher or sponsor if available, (i.e. company or university)	Date posted, published or last revised. (Often found at bottom of page or home page.)	Date Accessed (Day Month Year.) Eg. 12 Dec. 2010.	URL

Example 1: Hutton, Ronald. "Henry VIII: Majesty with Menace." *British History In-Depth*. BBC, 2010. Web. 4 Feb. 2010.

Note: N.p. = no publisher

Example 2: "The Marine Biome." *The World's Biomes*. University of California Museum of Paleontology, 2010. Web. 4 Feb. 2010.

Note: N.d. = no date
